

J.O. CRAVENS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The J.O. Cravens Memorial Scholarship honors the memory of J.O. Cravens, a lifelong rodeo cowboy and founding member of the International Professional Rodeo Association (IPRA) who valued education.

Cravens began his rodeo career in 1944 at age 13. As there were no youth rodeos, he was riding against adults and beating them. He competed in bareback and bull riding for more than 40 years retiring in the early 1980s.

As a founding member of the IPRA, he helped write the rules and bylaws of the association and served as its first bull riding director. He was runner-up to his traveling partner Ben Jordan for 11 world titles. Cravens qualified for the first International Finals Rodeo in bull riding.

At age 36 he started college while rodeoing, working and raising two daughters with his wife Mary, a two-time world champion barrel racer. He began teaching high school history while continuing to rodeo.

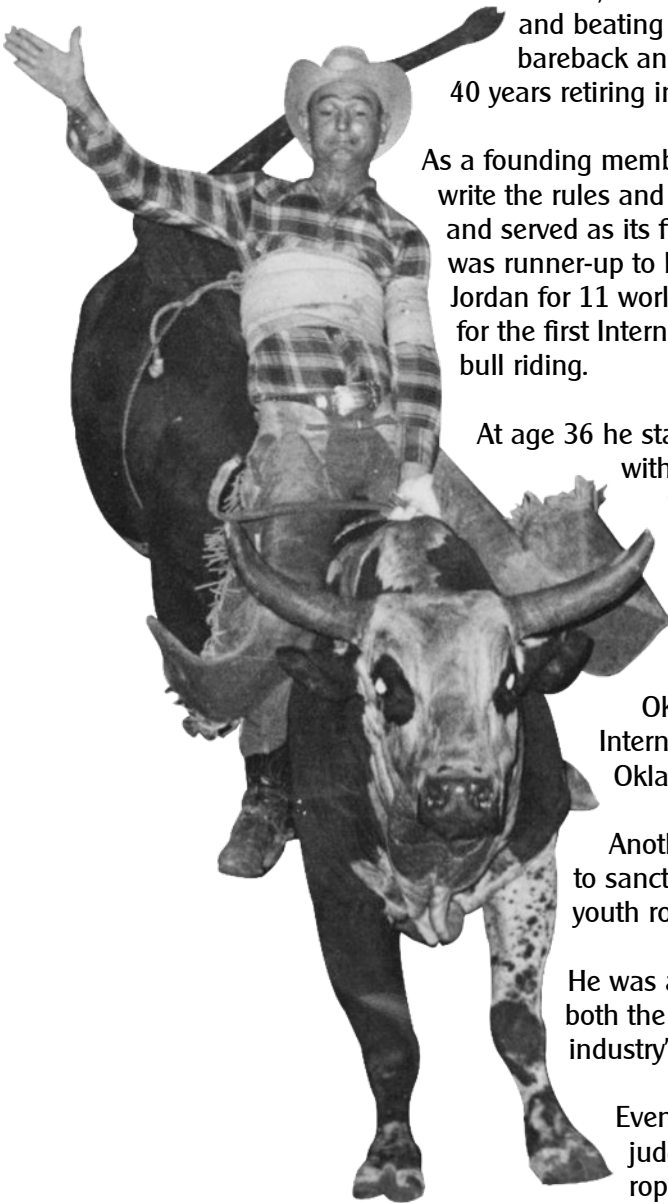
He served many years as a board member, president and executive director of the IPRA, retiring from teaching school to work full time for the association. During his time at the helm, the IPRA reached several milestones: moving its headquarters from Pauls Valley, Oklahoma, to Oklahoma City, exploring new venues for the International Finals Rodeo and making the decision to move the finals to Oklahoma City.

Another major move was partnering with the city of Shawnee, Oklahoma, to sanction the International Finals Youth Rodeo (IFYR), the world's richest youth rodeo in 1992. The event is held each year in July.

He was a longtime rodeo judge after he retired from competition, judging both the IFR and the IFYR many times. In 1966 he taught the the rodeo industry's first judges' clinic and continued training judges for years.

Even after he retired from judging professional rodeos, he continued judging youth rodeos and teaching young cowboys and cowgirls the ropes of rodeo.

J.O. Cravens died September 13, 2018, at age 87, and this scholarship honors two important aspects of his life: rodeo and education.
